Petaluma People Services Center	Workforce Development and School-to-Career connections	PPSC receives WIA funds for Petaluma and works with the entrepreneur team to integrate programs.
City of Petaluma	Connection to youth voice and School-to-Career.	Parks and Recs department funds youth programs that are under the direction of the City Entrepreneur. City staff manage work permit and pathfinder functions in Petaluma. City Entrepreneur staffs the Youth Commission (adults) and Teen Council (youth), which provide advisory functions to the City Council.
HC <sup>2</sup> (Heathly Communities Consortia)	Community Outreach and dialogues	The HC staff are co-located at the District Office. HC2 focuses on neighborhood outreach and community connections and participation.
Petaluma Learning and Guidance Center	After School Programs	PLGC works in partnership with CS <sup>2</sup> to design and implement the afterschool programs at two middle schools and one alternative high school. Part of that support includes Marriage and Family Therapists and interns who serve as program staff.

#### 5. Program Connections

<b>Program</b>	<b>How is it Connected?</b>
WIA	Community Entrepreneur employed by PPSC manages city WIA funded programs. She focuses on school drop-out prevention and out-of-school youth connections.
Perkins	District Entrepreneur oversees Perkins funds and Career Pathways system.
School-to-Career	Community Entrepreneurs employed by PPSC and the City represent Petaluma at the county level and manage funds.
School/Community Policing Program	District Entrepreneurs developed the program concept and provide technical assistance.
Vista/Americorp	District Entrepreneur coordinates with SSU to provide VISTA and Americorp resources to Petaluma. This relationship/partnership with SRJC and SSU is about articulation of courses and cross-age tutoring.
