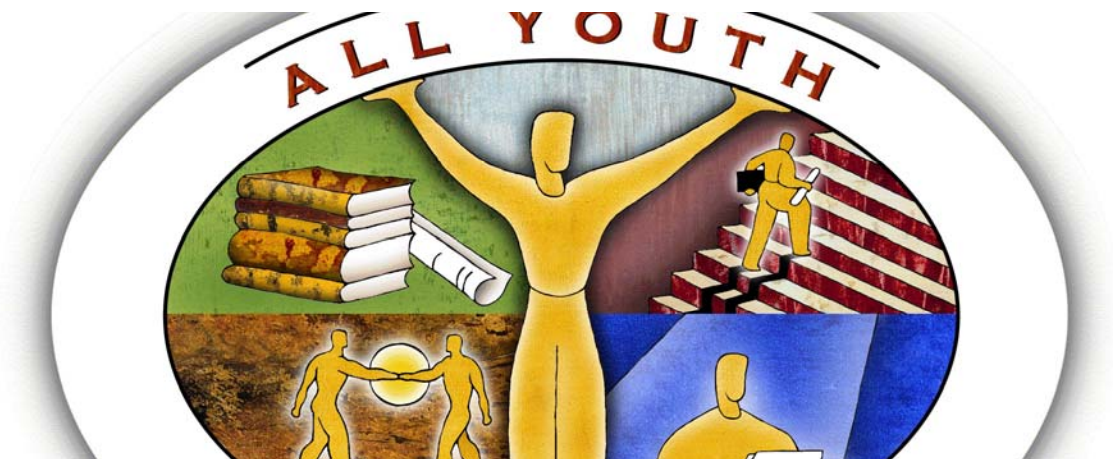

YCi Team Leader Meeting

Workshop Summary

On January 25, 2005, New Ways to Work and YCi hosted a **YCi Team Leader Meeting** at the All Youth-One System: Connected Conference 2005. Charlene Mouille from New Ways to Work and Virginia Hamilton from California Workforce Association facilitated this session for Youth Council staff and team leaders. At this network meeting, participants:

- Saw and provided feedback on the new YCi Elements chart;
- Discussed and provided feedback about effective practices that have supported Youth Council success with coordinating systems, building effective collaborations, and engaging youth;
- Provided feedback for YCi Network technical support in 2005; and
- Discussed tips and tools for engaging youth.

Hot Topics

Following a welcome and introductions, participants discussed the hot topics that are impacting the work of their Youth Councils and communities - this included:

- Private sector engagement
- Youth Opportunity - sustainability (YO)
- Partnership challenge – youth with disabilities/foster care – all youth
- Older youth credential
- Recruiting and retaining parents of youth on youth council
- Sustaining capacity/leadership – changing structures
- Younger youth – positioning schools/A-G courses complementing schools counselors

New YCi Elements of a Comprehensive Youth-Serving System Framework

Charlene Mouille discussed the latest iteration of the YCi Elements of a Comprehensive Youth-Serving System Framework. The framework has been going through a revision process following feedback from leaders and practitioners across California working with youth workforce development, foster youth, and youth with disabilities. Participants provided additional feedback during this session, which was incorporated into the latest version of the framework.
