Duncan Progress

There were a total of 44 Duncan students served under the Region 1 In School Youth Program during the 06/07 PY

36 program participants were enrolled into the academic tutorial program

Quarterly student school academic and attendance progress reports have been established and are shared with the FCEOC Academic Career Advisor

As a result of participation in the academic tutorial program, all 5 seniors enrolled graduated



Clovis Progress

Increased access to Counseling Staff and Student Records; Attendance, Class schedules and Progress Reports.

Discovered on-line testing and remediation on campus is more efficient for staff and more effective for students.

Since more recruiting is being done through classroom presentations and on-campus career fairs, more referrals are coming from campus and campus staff.

Open dialogue with CUSD administration, ROP and individual high schools about our partnership. Starting to see tangible products from relationship;

Two students hired from work experiences by CUSD in the past year that they had to create positions for.

Current discussions about scholarship for CYES students.



Kerman Progress

29 students were enrolled last year in the Co-Location at Kerman High School.

12 of the twenty nine enrolled students have completed the Online PassKey Tutorial lessons.

All of the seniors enrolled last school year graduated as scheduled in June 2007.

Regular on-site tutoring has improved the previous relationship with Kerman High School students and staff.



Coalinga Progress

West Hills College currently serves 20 participants who attend Coalinga High School.

Being Co-Located has created easy access to documentation such as copies of reports cards and progress reports and other documentation as needed.

Currently developing on-going relationships with high school counselors and staff to assist in recruitment and academic outcomes.
